## Rules for Accelerated Softball Tournaments 2015

The Tournament will be governed by the Official Rules as set forth in the ASA rule book with the exceptions noted herein.

1. **Rosters** must be completed and turned into the Field supervisor(ASA Rep) before the first game.
2. **Home Team** will be decided by a coin flip at home plate during pre-game conference. Championship game: undefeated team is home team. "IF" game will be decided by coin flip.
3. **Scoring** The Official scorekeeper will be a designated scorekeeper for the home team. Rosters/lineups must be exchanged by both teams prior to the pregame conference.
4. **Batting** Pool Play (Round Robin) may bat an entire line up. Bracket Play will use Standard ASA rules, DP/Flex Permitted
5. **Courtesy Runner** Standard ASA courtesy runner rule will apply.
6. **Runs** Pool Play 12U and under- The batting team may score a maximum of six (6) runs per inning, even if the hit that produced the sixth run also produced a seventh run. So, if six runs score before there are three outs, the batting team takes the field and the defensive team comes to bat.  
Bracket Play (Round Robin) - No inning run rules will apply.
7. **Runs Rule** A game will be called if one team is ahead by twelve runs after 3 innings, ten runs after 4 innings, or eight runs after 5 innings in both pool and bracket play
8. **Game Time Limits** Official game time starts with the coin flip and will be kept by umpire on the field. Pool play games are no new innings after 60 Minutes. Bracket (and Round Robin) play games are no new innings after 70 minutes. Championship game will be unlimited (7 innings, runs rule apply). "IF" game will be no new innings after 70 minutes
9. **Between Innings** To speed up the game between innings, pitchers only have two warm up pitches, one to the catcher and the other down to second base unless a new pitcher has entered the game that inning.
10. **Tie Breaker**
  - A. Pool Play: A tie game at the end of regulation will be followed by one (1) International tie break inning. If game is still tied after additional inning game will be decided by coin flip.
  - B. Bracket Play: A tie game at the end of regulation will be decided by standard International tie breaker rules.
11. **Seeding** Pool Play:
  - a. **FOUR TEAM POOLS**
    - 1ST PLACE--Team with 2-0 record
    - 2ND PLACE--Team that won 1st game, lost 2nd game
    - 3RD PLACE--Team that lost 1st game, won 2nd game
    - 4TH PLACE--Team with 0-2 record
  - b. **THREE TEAM POOLS**
    - 1.WON-LOSS record
    - 2.If all 3 teams are tied at 1-1 then:
      - A. Run differential
      - B. The fewest runs allowed
      - C. The most runs scored
      - D. Coin flip

**Seeding (Cont..)** Round Robin (4 or 5 team tournament):

- a. Record
- b. Head to head
- c. Fewest runs allowed
- d. Coin toss

- 12. Illegal Player** ASA roster rules apply and will be checked. If a team is caught using an illegal player; they will forfeit that game and will not be eligible for any tournament awards.
- 13. Equipment** The ASA Uniform Rule will be strictly enforced for all age divisions. This also includes coaches' attire and footwear, no Levi's or Levi shorts. All coaches must wear ID badge when on the field. Game balls for this tournament will be provided.
- 14. Smoking and Alcohol** There will not be any tobacco use on the field or in or around the dugout by any personnel! City of Tremonton prohibits the use of tobacco and alcohol at City parks.
- 15. Sportsmanship** Any team personnel and/or fans who display unsportsmanlike behavior will subject themselves and/or their team to suspension from that game and/or forfeit. If flagrant enough, it could cause suspension from the tournament.
- 16. Protests** Any protest must be acknowledged and recorded before the next pitch, Protests are discouraged and should be the exception rather than the rule.
  - a. Protests shall NOT be considered if they are based solely on a decision involving the accuracy of judgment on the part of an umpire.
  - b. Protests involving the misinterpretation of a playing rule; failure of an umpire to apply the correct rule on a given situation; and failure to impose the correct penalty for a given violation shall be administered by the tournament UIC. The following must be followed:
    - i. Notification of intent to protest must be made to the supervisor, plate umpire, scorekeeper, and opposing team captain, by the manager before the next pitch.
    - ii. Protests regarding an illegal player must be reported to the supervisor in charge by the Coach or Manager of the protesting team. Before the game is completed the supervisor will notify the opposing manager and the scorekeeper that the game is under protest. They will then check the field, copy rosters and the protest will be handled on the field at that time by UIC, ASA rep, or Tournament Director.
    - iii. During tournament play, all protests will be decided on the field by the supervisor/UIC. All tournament game protests must be made to the supervisor, plate umpire, scorekeeper, and opposing team captain before the game officially ends and acknowledged before the next pitch is made. After the game has officially ended, no protest will be considered.
  - c. The Tournament Committee will rule on all protests except rule interpretations. The Tournament Umpire-In-Chief will rule on rule interpretations. Any game that is protested will not continue until decided on by the appropriate authority
- 17. The Tournament Committee** reserves the right to make rulings not specifically covered herein which are deemed to be in the best interest of the Tournament. All decisions rendered by the Tournament Committee are final.
